SUBJECT - PREDICATE


When we form a sentence, we name a person or thing and say something about that person or thing.

The part of a sentence that names a person or thing is called the SUBJECT. The subject can be a word or a group of words. The part that tells us something about the subject is called the PREDICATE. The predicate contains a verb. It can be a word or a group of words.
