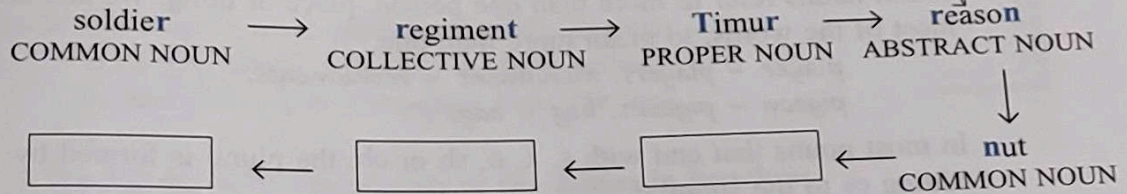

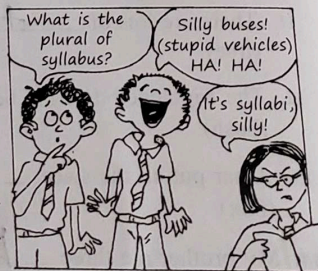

Some nouns are used only in the plural.

- ❖ instruments with two parts that form a pair: *scissors, tongs, spectacles*
- ❖ certain articles of clothing: *trousers, shorts, jeans*

COLLECTIVE NOUNS are usually used in the singular.

- A *flock of sheep* is grazing in the meadow.
- A *bunch of grapes* is hanging from the vine.
