## Chapter-7

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### Animal Behaviour:

Animal behaviour includes all the animals interact with other members of their own kind and with their environment.

### Shy animals:

#### Why animals are shy?

\* The animals who live alone or only in small group are not used to people or other animals near by them.

\* The animals who are usually hunted by human being/animals have fear of being eaten.

\* Shy animals eat food when no one is around.

Example: Deer, Bears, Monkeys and wild horses.



## Friendly animals:

\* These animals are friendly by nature and not afraid of people.

\* If you give them food they will come forward and eat.

Example: Pigeons, cows, dogs, goats

Dolphin, hen, Pigs and duck.

### Note:

\* All animals including wild animals love playing. They roll over or pull and push each other.

## Give and Take Relationships:

cattle egrets: These birds sit on the back of grazing animals such as cow and buffalo.

Oxpeckers: These birds ride on the back of giraffes and oxen



\* Both these kinds of birds eat insects which live on the skin of animals.

\* These birds alert these animals with a shrill call when they see an enemy.

## Ear of Animals:

External Ears: [We can see it]

Example: \* Elephants → They use the ear to fan and to hear itself

\* Donkey, Rabbit, giraffes → Big ear

\* Hippopotamus → Small ear

Internal Ears: [We cannot see the ear]

Birds: Tiny holes on both sides of their head.



Lizards → Small holes on their head.

Snakes → They can feel the movement or sound through the vibration on the ground.

### Body Hair:

\* The body of animals is covered with skin and hair.

\* Yak, Musk oxen and bear in cold areas →

They have long hair which keep them warm.

\* Fish and Snakes → Scales

\* Cow and Buffalo → They have short hair as they live in warm region.

\* Different designs on animal's skin are due to the presence of different coloured hairs.

\* Leopard [Spots], Tigers [Striped coat] This help them to hide in bushes and chase the prey.
