


We use **a** or **an** when we talk about one person, one animal, one place, or one thing. We use **a** before nouns which begin with consonants. EXAMPLES: **a** banana, **a** cat We use **an** before nouns which begin with vowels – **a**, **e**, **i**, **o**, **u**. EXAMPLES: **an** apple, **an** elephant

Use a before nouns which begin with consonants. Use an before nouns which begin with vowels.

The is used in place of a or an when we talk about a noun a second time. EXAMPLE: I saw a house. The house was big.
We also use the before some proper nouns. It is used before the names of * oceans and seas — the Indian Ocean, the Red Sea
* rivers — the Ganga, the Nile
* famous buildings — the White House, the Red Fort
* things that are only one of their kind — the Earth, the Sun
