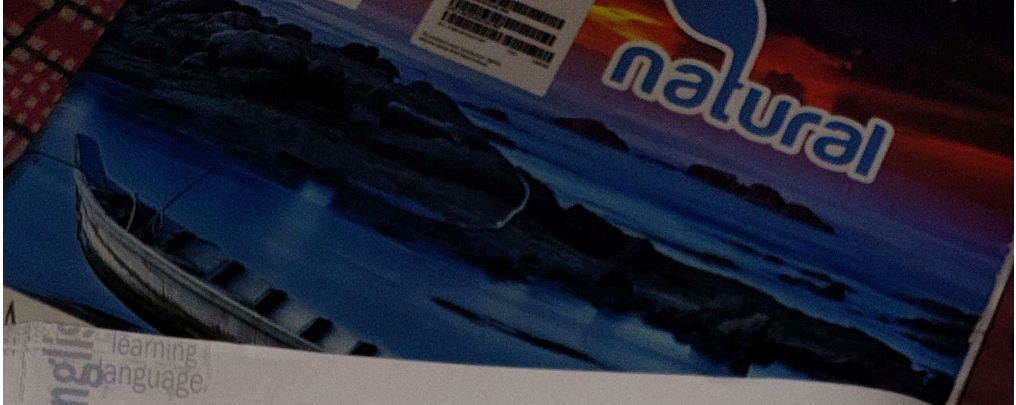

Bill Gates is a wealthy person.

He is very generous too.

ADJECTIVES OF NUMBER or numeral adjectives show how many persons or things are meant, or in what order a person or thing stands.

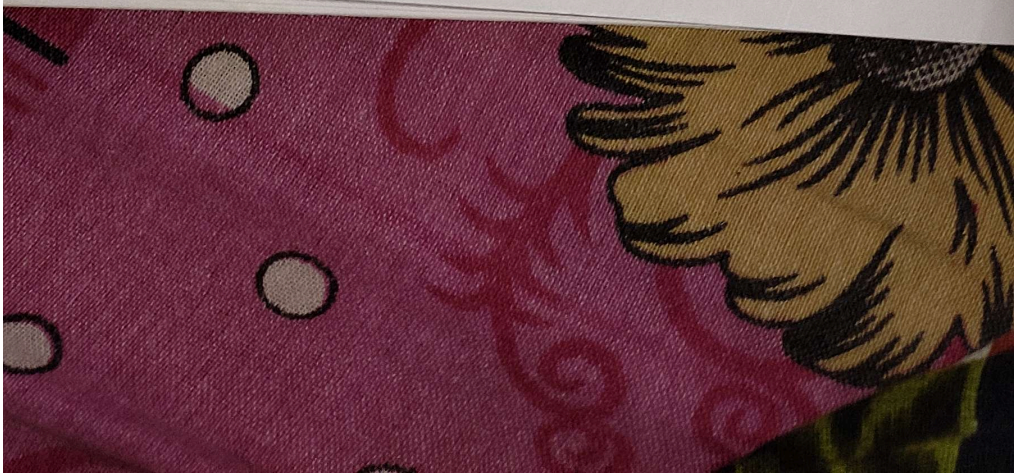
There are eight planets in the solar system.

The Earth is the fifth largest planet.

DISTRIBUTIVE NUMERAL ADJECTIVES such as each, every, either, neither refer to each one of a number. They are used with singular nouns.

Each planet circles around the Sun.

Neither Mercury nor Venus have moons.
