- An adverb is a word that adds something more to a verb, an adjective and another adverb.

Types of adverbs.

Adverb of manner :=
when the words describes how something happens.

EX - He drove the car carefully.

Dina spoke rudely.

We clean the table neatly.

Adverb of Place :=

when the words describe where something happens.

- The accident occurred here.

3. Adverb of time :-

The adverb words that show when something happens.

Ex - Alice arrived at my house early.
I sang song at the school programme yesterday.

4. Adverb of frequency :-

The words that describes "how often an action happens".

Like - always, often, sometime, never, usually.

Ex - I always walk to work.
He sometime wakes up early.
We are never unhappy.
Barking dog seldom bites.

5. Adverb of degree :-

The words that tell us about the intensity of something happens.

Ex - He was too careless.
The sea is very stormy.
He is almost always late.
They are extremely happy.
The tea is too hot.
