Prepositions

★ Prepositions show the relationship of a noun or a pronoun with another word in a sentence.

Examples

1. A cat is on the chair.
2. The children are on the swing.

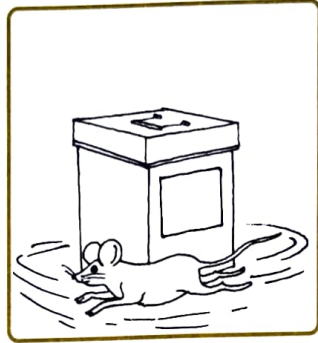

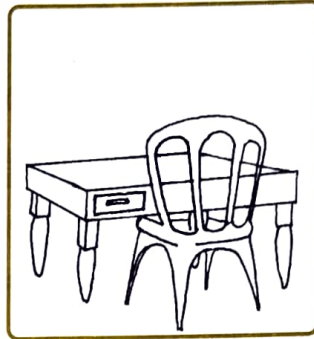
Prepositions often tell us the position of something in relation to another.

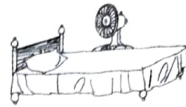
