I finished reading the book **in** three days.

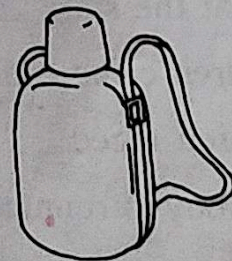
Some commonly used prepositions are in, from, over, under, below, beside, for, at, by, of, off, out, on, through and with.
