③ Describe our National Emblem.

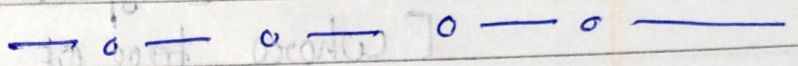
Ans: National Emblem :

Currency: * The money that is used in a particular country at a particular time.

* Currency consists of

}	→ Coins
	→ Banknotes

* The Indian currency is called the rupee.

Coin: → Money made of metal is called coin.

→ one side → [Its value]

→ ~~the other side~~ [Year of minting]

→ other side [The National Emblem]

Watermark:

* It is used as security features of banknotes.

* The white space on left side of note [where face of Mahatma Gandhi printed]

Bank Note → Serial number at top right and bottom left corners.

→ The signature of the Governor of the Reserve Bank of India
↓
[Bottom centre of the note]

→ value of note $\left\{ \begin{array}{l} \text{Centre} \\ \text{At the sides.} \end{array} \right.$

→ value of note [In 15 Indian on left side languages]
