



When we write, we use an apostrophe (') before the s if it is a singular noun. This is Sonam's hockey stick.

We place the apostrophe after the s if it is a plural noun ending in s. The girls' cricket team did very well this year.


If the plural noun does not end in an s we place the apostrophe before the s. The children's joy knew no bounds.
